WYC's Parent Connection programs:

How to Talk So Kids Will Listen - a six-part workshop with Susan Bauerfeld, PhD at the Wilton Library. In this workshop based on the book *How to Talk So Kids will Listen*, you will learn skills and strategies you can apply right away for positive changes within your family. This class uses exercises to understand the adverse impact of many of our default parenting/communication styles. Save the Date: Dr. Suniya Luthar to speak to parents -Oct. 21, 2016 at 10:00 AM. Dr. Luthar, Ph.D., Foundation Professor of Psychology at Arizona State University and Professor Emerita of Columbia University's Teachers College, will speak at Wilton High School Little Theater on Oct. 21, 2016 at 10:00 AM. While on faculty at Yale University, she conducted a groundbreaking study of students in Westport, CT finding that affluent teenagers have the elevated levels of anxiety and depression most people associate with children in poverty. Dr. Luthar will explain this phenomenon to parents and school staff, and educate us on strategies to foster strength and resilience in our youth. She will also touch on her more recent research on motherhood and the challenges facing mothers of adolescents today.

NAMI Support Group for Parents

School is back in session and for many children, so is the academic and social stress that can cause behavioral changes. The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Child and Adolescent Network (CAN) is a support group for parents of children with behavioral, emotional and mental health issues. The meeting is free, confidential, safe and led by trained volunteer facilitators who themselves have had personal experiences raising children with these concerns. Our meetings are a place to speak freely and be understood without embarrassment or the fear of being judged or treated differently. Parents come from Redding, Weston, Westport, Wilton and towns in the surrounding area.
